Child Safety

All students enrolled at St Joseph's have the right to feel safe and be safe. The wellbeing of children in our care will always be our priority. We aim to create a child-safe environment where children are free to enjoy life to the full without any concern for their safety. To ensure that we create a safe and positive learning environment, St Joseph's are committed to the following:

- Aboriginal children and young people have the right to feel safe and included. Aboringal culture and history is celebrated at St Joseph's.
- The leadership team will ensure that they act responsibly, set a good example, and prioritise the safety of all students.
- Staff will help to create an environment built on trust, where students feel comfortable to express concern to an adult and their peers.
- Families will feel comfortable to work in collaboration with staff, and support their child/ren to understand what it means to feel and be safe.
- Everyone has the right to feel welcome, and diversity should be embraced and seen as an opportunity to learn from one another.
- Suitable staff are hired to work at St Joseph's that uphold the school values and protect students from harm.
- All complaints are to be taken seriously and there are to be clear steps for staff and students to follow when making and actioning a complaint.

- There is a shared understanding of what child safety is, why it is important, and what to look for and do if a complaint arises.
- When working online, it is important to consider the risks involved and staff should be aware of the problems that may arise in this ever changing environment.
- Ongoing training and the review of policies will occur regularly to ensure that we continue to be a child-safe school and that the wellbeing of each child is prioritised.



Code of Conduct

Our three school rules at St Joseph's are;

Respect for self Respect for others Respect for the environment

In addition to this, we have a Code of Conduct. This focuses on keeping children and young people at St Joseph's safe from harm. All staff and visiting adults at St Joseph's are expected to follow this too. The Code of Conduct lists what behaviours are acceptable and unacceptable in our community.
