



Permitted Workers Permits: Stage 4 Restrictions

Dear Families,

Due to the rapid and hourly changing landscape since the introduction of **Stage 4 Restrictions**, we are doing our best to stay on top of all matters pertaining to these new restrictions and associated guidelines. From an on-site perspective, we have been required to scale back considerably, and we continue to implement and adapt to new key operational practices and procedures over the coming days.

A notable change has been the introduction of **Permitted Workers Permits** and tighter associated guidelines for our sector. Whilst we remain confident that this will not impact on the delivery of the remote learning program for the children and families, most staff will continue to work remotely, off-site, unless required for on-site supervision and the scaled back general operational practices.

In light of these changes and increasing associated administration demands, we ask for your understanding and please note the following key pieces of information:

- All families (both parents) applying to access the '**On-Site Supervision Program**' must now email a copy of their **Permitted Workers Permits** to the Principal as proof that they must attend their place of work and cannot be at home to supervise their child/ren. Unfortunately, no permit/permits will mean you are unable to access the On-Site Supervision Program. This is a directive of the State government and we must comply with the regulations.
- Please note this is effective from '**Friday 7th August.**'
- Parent/s of **extremely vulnerable** students will be contacted directly by the principal via email in order to access the program.

- We are also in the process of determining the best means to distribute the next round of 'Take-Home Learning Packs.' We anticipate this will require some even tighter practices to align with Stage 4 Restrictions and further correspondence will follow in the coming days.

We sincerely thank you for your understanding and trust that we will keep all families abreast of key developments as we continue to prioritize the safety and wellbeing of all members of our community.
